Purpose

This document provides you with the key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. We are providing this information in order to help you understand the nature, risks and costs of this product along with the potential gains and losses that an investor in this product might make, to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

Product

The product this document relates to is the **Seneca AIM EIS Fund when purchased upon the advice of an authorised financial adviser**. The manufacturer and Fund Manager of this product is Seneca Partners Ltd, 9 The Parks, Newton-le-Willows, WA12 0JQ. Seneca Partners Ltd is authorised and regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority.

What is this product?

The product is an Alternative Investment Fund which aims to buy shares in five to ten AIM quoted companies that qualify under the Enterprise Investment Scheme.

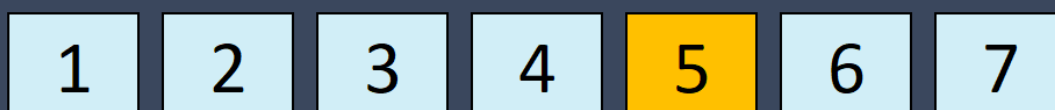
If you invest, the objective of the Fund is to invest your money within 12 months for a four year period, targeting a return of 1.5 times the amount invested, net of fees but excluding tax relief. Please note that target returns are not guaranteed and you may get back less than you invested.

The intended investor will be seeking long term capital growth in a tax efficient manner, from a portfolio of higher risk investments and meet the FCA's definition of being either a High Net Worth Individual or a Sophisticated Investor.

Whilst an investor may benefit from certain tax reliefs and exemptions when investing in this product, there are no insurance benefits associated with investment.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. The Summary Risk Indicator for this product is as follows:

We have classified this product as 5 out of 7, which is a medium to high risk class.

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for four to five years. This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. It is unlikely that you will be able to cash in your investment early.

The following table shows the money you could get back over the next five years, under different scenarios, assuming that you invest £20,000. The scenarios shown illustrate how your investment could perform. You can compare them with the scenarios of other products.

You may be able to cash in your product in the early years if there is sufficient liquidity in the market for us to sell your shares. If you shares are sold prior to you having owned them for three years (or the company in which you are invested having traded for three years, whichever is the later) your shares will no longer qualify for the tax reliefs available under the Enterprise Investment Scheme. You would therefore be required to pay back some or all of the Income Tax relief you have received and any Capital Gains Tax that you deferred when making your investment.

The scenarios presented are an estimate of future performance and are not an exact indicator. What you get will vary depending on how the market performs and how long you keep the investment/product. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances, and it does not take into account the situation where we are not able to pay you.

What happen if Seneca Partners Ltd is unable to pay out?

Seneca Partners do not handle or hold investors' money or shares. Cash is held in a client account controlled by the Fund's Custodian, Woodside Corporate Services Ltd, 4th Floor, 50 Mark Lane, London EC3R 7QR. Shares are held by the Fund's Nominee, WCS Nominees Ltd. Both Seneca Partners Ltd and Woodside Corporate Services Ltd participate in the Financial Services Compensation Scheme which provides compensation to eligible investors in the event of them being unable to meet its customer liabilities. Payments under the protected investment business scheme are limited to a maximum of £85,000.

Should any investee company be unable to pay out, there is no compensation scheme available for monies invested in that company.

What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

The person or firm selling you or advising you about this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person or firm will provide you with information about these costs and show you the impact that all costs will have on your investment over time.

1. Costs over time

The following are investment scenarios based on an investment of £20,000. For the purposes of these scenarios, it has been assumed that the Fund Manager exits all investments on the fifth anniversary. Where a range of example costs has been given, the lower figures relates to the "unfavourable scenario" and the higher figures the "favourable scenario" shown in the table towards the top of this page.

2. Composition of costs

The table below shows the impact each year of the different types of costs on the investment return you might get at the end of the recommended holding period and the meaning of the different cost categories.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

You should expect to hold this investment for four to five years. You may be able to cash in your product in the early years if there is sufficient liquidity in the market for us to sell your shares. If your shares are sold prior to you having owned them for three years (or the company in which you are invested having traded for three years, whichever is the later) your shares will no longer qualify for the tax reliefs available under the Enterprise Investment Scheme.
